Readings for the Feast of the Epiphany (pp. 404-405): Today's great and ancient liturgical celebration of Christ's "manifestation" recalls beautiful historical events replete with their own deep theological meaning: they reveal the answer to the question of *why* God became man – the central theme of the Christmas season. And that answer, of course, is – *for the salvation of the whole world*. The Magi who came from afar, as gentiles, to adore the Divine Infant represent the future coming of all nations to worship Christ as King and Savior. Isaiah's prophecy (1st reading) points forward to this universality, and St. Paul (2nd reading) tells the Ephesians explicitly: the great mystery has been now been revealed that the Gentiles are "coheirs" with Jews to Christ's promises. The magi had been followers of a pre-Christian pagan religion that somehow pointed toward Christ, and they now came to a fuller knowledge of the true God – lying in a manger! We too are called to a new conversion as we worship the Divine Child.
