Readings for 3rd Sunday of the Year (pp. 537-538): The Gospel again invites us to retrace our Lord's first steps in his public ministry: today we hear of his calling of a group of close disciples – in a quite "unorthodox" move! A talented and ambitious rabbi would normally have based his new movement in Jerusalem, seeking disciples who already showed interest and ability in studying the Law. But Jesus starts in remote Galilee, where pagans have been mixed with Israelites ever since the Assyrian invasion in Isaiah's time, and chooses twelve simple fishermen – the number of Israel's tribes – telling them he will make them "fishers of men", pioneers of a *New* Israel. We're reminded that we too don't have to be theologians or canon lawyers in order to be apostles! *All* of us are capable of evangelizing those around us who "walk in darkness", helping them to see the "great light" of Christ (1st reading).

Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to express my opposition to BB 203, which seeks to make St. Louis a sanctuary city for abortion. This ordinance threatens the religious and moral convictions of Catholics and others of good will who do not want to support abortion.

If this Bill were to become law, Catholic employers and others who oppose abortion could be fined for refusing to hire people who publically support abortion, and could also be required to include abortion in any health benefit package offered employees, since these packages are a benefit of employment. Landlords could also be forced to rent to people who want to perform abortions, or support the abortion industry.

The city of St. Louis has many other problems that deserve our attention. BB 203 is unnecessary and divisive.
