Sunday Collection, January 22<sup>nd</sup>:

**Readings for 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year (pp. 542-543):** The main common theme in today's readings is the wonderful way in which God so often uses what is weak, small, humble and insignificant in the eyes of the world to bring about his great purposes. He so often overturns and confounds our human expectations. In Isaiah's prophecy (1<sup>st</sup> reading) the Lord warns that even among his own people of Israel – so often rebellious! – it will be only a remnant, "humble and holy" who will fulfill his will and enjoy his blessing. St. Paul in our 2<sup>nd</sup> reading stresses to the Corinthians that most of them have been called by God not as wise, powerful citizens or members of the aristocracy, but as lowly and even "foolish" folks in the sight of the world, so there would be no room for boasting on their part. Likewise, the Gospel reading (Matthew 5) presents us with the immortal words of the Beatitudes. Here we have perhaps the best -known of all Jesus' ethical teachings, in which he upturns conventional, worldly human wisdom. It is those who are meek, humble, pacific, in mourning, and even persecuted for Christ who are blessed, says the Lord, because they are living in the light of eternity, as God's children.

**Feast of 'Candlemas':** This **Thursday, February 2^{nd}**, we will finalize the extended Christmas season with a *Missa Cantata* (sung Mass with full Gregorian chants in the Traditional Latin Rite) the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary (renamed the 'Presentation in the Temple' in the new rite). We will begin at **7:00 p.m.** with the traditional procession and blessing of candles. The event we also celebrate as the Fourth Joyful Mystery of the Rosary fulfilled Malachi's prophecy in an unexpected and profound moment of divine drama: The Lord, the Light of the World, symbolized by our candles, enters his Temple, filling it with light – but as a tiny babe, with no fanfare and unrecognized by all except holy Simeon and Anna. Please bring along for blessing your candles destined for religious use.

## Suggested Message (endorsed by Archdiocesan Respect Life Office):

Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to express my opposition to BB 203, which seeks to make St. Louis a sanctuary city for abortion. This ordinance threatens the religious and moral convictions of Catholics and others of good will who do not want to support abortion.

If this Bill were to become law, Catholic employers and others who oppose abortion could be fined for refusing to hire people who publically support abortion, and could also be required to include abortion in any health benefit package offered employees, since these packages are a benefit of employment. Landlords could also be forced to rent to people who want to perform abortions, or support the abortion industry.

The city of St. Louis has many other problems that deserve our attention. BB 203 is unnecessary and divisive.
