Readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent (pp. **438-439):** We now enter into the most dramatic moments of the entire liturgical year, with *Passiontide* beginning today. We accompany Christ toward Jerusalem for his imminent cosmic conflict with Satan! The Introit (Psalm 42) sets the tone, praying for deliverance of the Just One from wicked, deceitful and ungodly men. Isaiah's prophecy speaks to us of desert wastelands, but with God's promise of turning them into streams of water. St. Paul (2nd reading) opens his heart to the Philippians, revealing his passionate identification with the suffering but conquering Christ, in comparison with which he deems worthless all else in this mortal life. In today's Gospel (John ch. 8), our Lord, shaming the scribes and Pharisees who seek to condemn the woman taken in adultery, earns their increasingly bitter enmity, which will soon result in a plot to have him killed.

We are nearing the end of Lent! We're making the Stations of the Cross in the church this Friday at 7:00 p.m. We invite you to come and follow the steps of our Lord's passion and death.

Feast of St. Joseph: This Solemnity will be marked by a sung Latin Mass in the extraordinary form at **9:00 a.m., this Saturday, March 19th**. Our precious relic of St. Joseph's cloak will be brought out for individual veneration and blessing at the end of Mass, and the traditional 'St. Joseph's bread' will be given out to worshippers. *Following the Mass there will be a servers' practice for Palm Sunday*.

'Mass Mob', March 20: Next Sunday we begin Holy Week with Palm Sunday. This year we look forward to welcoming hundreds of visitors to our historic church, which has been selected to participate in the "Mass Mob" program, which is highlighting churches of particular historical and artistic importance in St. Louis. There will be **just one Palm Sunday Mass**, at **10:00 a.m.**, combining both our 9:00 and 11:00 congregations.. Help raise funds by baking a batch of cookies to sell that day!
