Readings for 4th Sunday of Easter: For over a thousand years the Church has celebrated in Eastertide “Good Shepherd Sunday”, when we listen to the tenth chapter of St. John’s Gospel. Today we’re reminded that the Risen Christ is not only our Savior and Judge, but also our loving Pastor – one who continues to guide and watch over us, the sheep of his flock, during our earthly pilgrimage. The life of a shepherd could require heroism, as the Apostles quickly learned as shepherds delegated by the Good Shepherd. They suffer persecution from their Jewish compatriots (1st reading, Acts 13), but, as the immortal symbolism of Apocalypse expresses it, they will earn the eternal reward of the martyrs’ “palm”, having “washed their robes . . . white in the blood of the Lamb” (2nd reading).

Special Collection: Catholic Home Missions: Next Sunday (24th) we’ll take up the annual collection to assist needy dioceses here in the U.S., in areas like Appalachia, the South, Southwest, and the Rocky Mountains. These funds are essential from helping poverty-stricken Catholics, and are vital in financing the seminary education of future priests in these poor dioceses. Thanks for your generosity!

Annual Catholic Appeal: April is the month in which the appeal begins for the needs of the whole Catholic Church in St. Louis in a very special way. Senate Joint Resolution #39: This important *religious freedom* measure, supported by the Missouri bishops, has passed the State Senate and is now coming up for a vote in the House of Representatives. After he and others lobbied representatives on April 6, Fr. Harrison went to the Capitol again last Tuesday night to testify in favor of the resolution at a House Committee hearing. It will place on the November ballot an amendment to the State Constitution protecting wedding vendors from being forced to offer their services for same-sex wedding ceremonies, against their conscientious religious beliefs. Please pray for the success of this resolution, which is supported by our Missouri bishops.
