**Finances, July 2015-June 2016:** Income: \$98,891.02; Expenses: \$111,777.41; **Net loss: \$12,886.39.**  
(Without the \$5,000 ‘Mass Mob’ collection on March 20 and two large donations by benefactors totaling \$17,000, our net loss for the 2015-2016 financial year would have been much greater, around \$34,000.)

**Readings for the 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday (p. 613-615):** Today’s Scripture passages highlight the tremendous importance of *faith*: not merely of being a believer rather than an unbeliever, but of seeing the whole of life – and death! – through the eyes of faith and in the light that it provides us for understanding why we are here and whither we are heading. The first reading (Wisdom 18) recalls the Israelites’ faith in God’s protection at the time of their enslavement and liberation in Egypt. The 2<sup>nd</sup> reading (Hebrews 11) is one of key biblical texts about the nature of faith, as illustrated in the lives of the ancient patriarchs. The Gospel reminds us that our faith requires us to live every day in the light of eternity, setting our hearts on heaven and being prepared to meet our Judge at any moment.

**Latin America Apostolate Collection:** Today we take up the annual special collection for our Archdiocesan missionary apostolate in Latin America. For many years St. Louis has been supporting our needy Catholic brothers and sisters in this region, especially Bolivia. Thanks for your contribution!

**Assumption of Our Lady, Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>:** The beautiful feast of Mary’s Assumption body and soul into heaven will fall adjacent to a Sunday, and so is not a holy day of obligation this year. We will celebrate this First-Class Feast with a **9:00 a.m.** Traditional Latin Mass at the high altar.
