**Readings for the Feast of the Holy Family (pp. 400-402):** This is a surprisingly recent feast in the Church's calendar. Pope Leo XIII introduced it a little over a century ago for some dioceses; but it was only in 1921 that Benedict XV extended its celebration to the universal Church. Now, more than ever, there is a tremendous need to venerate and pray to the Holy Family, as we see so many divorces and families breaking up, more children growing up without the presence of their father, and the very definition of true marriage and family life being undermined by radical propaganda, which in turn influences legislatures and judges. The Gospel today (Luke, ch. 2) presents us with the only incident we know of from the boyhood of Jesus: the Son of God himself was *obedient* to human parents.

**Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God:** On New Year's Day, **Friday January 1**<sup>st</sup>, the Church will fittingly begin the year 2016 by honoring Our Lady, the one through whom the work of our salvation began. This is a holy day of obligation. For New Year 'early birds', Fr. Harrison will offer Mass in the Traditional Latin Rite at **8:00 a.m.**, followed by our usual Friday Holy Hour (Eucharistic adoration) in the Holy Cross Chapel from 9:00 till 10:00 a.m., for those who can stay. Then there will be a sung *Novus Ordo* Latin Mass at **11:00 a.m.** (same format as our 9:00 a.m. Sunday Mass). Don't forget to pray at our beautiful 150-year-old **crib scene** before or after Mass in the Christmas season! Next Sunday (Jan. 3<sup>rd</sup>) we will celebrate the beautiful **Feast of the Epiphany**, recalling the visit of the Magi to the Infant Jesus.
