Preface of the Epiphany : Christ, Light of the Nations

It is truly fitting and just, right and salutary, that we always and everywhere give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. For today you have made known the mystery of our redemption in Christ, so that it might be a beacon to the nations; moreover, when he appeared in our nature’s mortal frame, then with the new splendor of his own immortality did you restore us to life unending. Thus it is that, in company with the Angels, the Archangels, the Thrones, the Dominations, in company with the entire host of the heavenly army, we sing our song of praise to your glory, chanting without ceasing: [followed by ‘Sanctus’]

Antiphona ad Communionem Communion Antiphon (chanted by schola): Matthew 2: 2

Vidimus stellam eius in Oriente, et venimus cum muneribus adorare Dominum.

Lord, please guide us always and everywhere with your divine light. May our vision be clear to see the mystery in which you have willed us to take part, and our love be fitting to receive it. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
